MEC supports people in the Middle East and North Africa who are marginalised, discriminated against or persecuted for being or becoming Christians.

As an example in the first 8 months of 2023 MEC engaged in over 170 confirmed cases of religious persecution in more than 24 countries. The funding requested will help Kim with necessary costs relating to international travel, accommodation and media work. He works with governments and others giving a voice to persecuted Christians.

Café Create, based in Claremont House, has expanded and now opens every Thursday, Friday and Saturday 10am - 2pm. It brings together the marginalised and wider community so that it provides a safe space that enables a range of creative activities to take place. The café presently supports up to 150 people on average each week and now excitingly employs a permanent kitchen manager.

Musalaha continues to bring Israelis and Palestinians of different ethnic, religious, and geographical backgrounds together promoting reconciliation as demonstrated in the life and teaching of Jesus.

Musalaha runs an annual summer camp that brings together hundreds of children to start the process of reconciliation. The camp focuses on the first stage in the reconciliation process: *Building Relationships*. It is an excellent opportunity for children to make new friends of both similar and different ethnic, religious, and geographical backgrounds. They share cabins, mealtimes, engage in arts and crafts, and participate in a variety of water games, sports, competitions, and more.
