It's Holy Week!

Starting with Palm Sunday, we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem when the crowds waved palm leaves and shouted 'Hosanna', which means 'He saves'. But it wasn't long until the shouting changed to 'crucify him' and the triumph turned to tragedy as Jesus is arrested, flogged and killed on a Roman cross. But three days later, Jesus is resurrected from the dead. It's a massive turning point as Jesus wins a mighty victory over death and sin. And we join with a new shout of 'Halleluiah, He is risen!' on Easter Sunday, the greatest day in history.
