Rev Alan writes...



Fix Our Eyes on Jesus - Jesus and Everyday Life Much of last year's teaching in our sermons focussed on what it means to be part of Jesus' Church. This brought us to an understanding that the church belongs to Jesus, that we are his possession, and that we relate to each other as his family, and that we are called to join his mission, which links with our Verse for the Year 2025 from Joshua 24:15 "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord". Verse cards are available at all services and the Parish Office, please take one or two to display somewhere prominent at home or work.

We summarised our definition of church as *Jesus'* family on *Jesus' Mission* and have looked at the five ways we can commit to this through our giving, meeting, serving, baptism and sharing, and prayer.

Now, as we move into a New Year, we will start to explore more deeply Jesus' teaching and guidance for our everyday lives and relationships. It is often challenging and causes us to re-evaluate our attitudes, choices and behaviour. It is a call to **fix our eyes on Jesus**, the author and perfector of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). We will learn that Jesus taught "as one with authority" (Matthew 7:28-29). We will seek to surrender our own authority and autonomy to live under Jesus' authority.

In this new series, *Jesus and Everyday Life*, we will look at Jesus' teaching on the practical matters of everyday life. What Jesus said about money, poverty, forgiveness, relationships, and how to deal with broken relationships.

The series has 6 talks, over the coming 8 weeks leading until Lent. The talks will be punctuated by a special **Mission Sunday** on 26 January, where evangelists from the Message Trust will speak at all our services in the morning and evening. And we will also hold Annual Meeting Vision services at each fellowship during this time.



In our 6.30pm Parish-wide services at St Peter's each Sunday, we start a new series called **The Great Explorers.**

The Bible is full of great explorers. We read about men and women who heard and accepted God's call to explore throughout the pages of Scripture. Abraham "obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going." Esther, knowing the perils of the journey that lay before her, cried out, "if I perish, I perish." The Apostle Paul's expeditions included three shipwrecks! He even spent "a night and a day...adrift at sea." This series will examine the lives of the Bible's great explorers and teach us to long for the great adventure every great explorer experienced when they were obedient and set out on the expedition to which God called them. Rev Vinny Whitworth will kickstart the series looking at Abraham from Genesis 11:27–12:9.

I hope and pray that these new series' help you to grow in your knowledge and understanding of God's call on your life.

From Your Correspondent in Uganda!

I have arrived safely after a long 15-hour flight, I changed planes in Doha. I have just about defrosted from the snow and ice in Bolton and the weather is hot and sticky, about 27c. Uganda is on the equator and is a beautiful country, it is lush and teeming with life. 12 hours day and night and summertime all year



round. Winston Churchill called it the Pearl of Africa. The people are so friendly, and it is exciting to connect with the AYF (Anglican Youth Fellowship) choir and band members who are hosting me. It is early in the visit, but already I have joined a choir

rehearsal and spent time catching up with friends old and new. Over the next week the plan is to join the wider AYF for a family day, take part in the recording of a TV show for the Ugandan Anglican church's TV channel, and visit the Oasis Children's Orphanage. I'll keep you all updated. Thanks so much for your prayers and encouragement!
